



Entry Period: Entries must be submitted no later than July 20, 2020, 11:59 pm EST. No late entries will be accepted.

How the Class Works:

- Six class sections will be offered:
 - Children's Mini-Medal 2'6"
 - Adult Mini-Medal 2'6"
 - Children's Medal 3'
 - Adult Medal 3'
 - Low Jr/Sr Medal (3'3")
 - Jr/Sr Medal (3'6")
- Riders must complete the designated course for the division they enter (see enclosed course). Riders may only enter and submit a video for one division.
- Riders should dress in show attire as they would for a live medal class. Horses should be well groomed, but braiding is neither expected nor required (and will not factor into a rider's score).
- The round must be recorded and uploaded to YouTube. Please see the section below on how to record your video. Your video will not be posted publicly without your permission.

Judging

The class is an equitation class and will be judged as such. Each rider will be judged over their single round as submitted, with no further testing. You will be evaluated on the judge's interpretation of the ideal for your chosen medal section. The judge determines which riders come closest to those ideals collectively and places riders in 1st–10th place. Jim Dahlquist (USEF-R Hunter) will judge all sections.

Results

Class results will be posted online for first through tenth place by July 27th, 2020; those individuals will also be notified by email. These riders will receive a ribbon. Class winners will additionally receive a prize.

Rules

1. Donations are encouraged: suggested donation of \$15 from OHJA Members and \$25 from non-members. All proceeds will go towards the OHJA Scholarship Fund. Donations can be made here: <http://medal.givesmart.com>
2. When entering the OHJA Virtual Medal Class, you ACKNOWLEDGE THAT YOU HAVE READ AND VOLUNTARILY AGREE TO THE RELEASE & WAIVER OF LIABILITY & INDEMNITY AGREEMENT enclosed in this packet.
3. Set the medal course (see downloadable course diagram in this packet). Choose your medal section (Children's Mini-Medal 2'6", Adult Mini-Medal 2'6", Children's Medal 3', Adult Medal 3', Low Jr/Sr Medal (3'3"), Jr/Sr Medal (3'6")) and set all fences to that height. Be sure to include ground lines in front of every fence. Adjust the distance of related line. *Set trot jump to 2'3" for all sections/heights.*
4. You must wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet and appear in proper hunter-show attire; half-chaps are permitted with heeled boots.
5. Coaching during the test is not allowed.
6. The natural background sound for the test must be audible. *Rounds with no sound will be disqualified.*
7. You must submit your video via a YouTube link through your online entry at https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSfAfAYZ54R1VsLTJ JSgQDdAWTfl YsAvtdhX-v ZjuAb9BnbQ/viewform?usp=sf_link. Include rider name and medal section in title of upload.
8. If the judge determines that the horse appears lame, the judge has the right to eliminate the rider from consideration.
9. Horses and riders are required to abide by standard equipment rules for equitation. The rider acknowledges that by submitting his/her entry, he/she agrees to abide by standard rules of fair play and horse welfare.
10. Violation of any of these rules may result in the refusal to accept the entry or non-refundable scratch.
11. This virtual show does not count toward any awards points for any organization.
12. We will make every effort to judge this class fairly with the knowledge that there are inherent challenges to judging online shows that make it different from the real-life experience.

How To Record Your Round

Study our course, choose your fence height (2'6, 3', 3'3 and 3'6) and set all fences to that height. Adjust related line accordingly. *Set trot jump to 2 3 for all sections/heights.* You are ready to record your video. *Note: Videos of rounds must be one continuous filming; unedited from start to finish and have natural sound throughout.*

1. Using a phone or video camera, have a helper video your round: Your helper will stand outside the arena, midway down the long side (see course diagram for which side), ideally in an outdoor arena/field during the daytime. For best results, the camera should not be facing into the sun. An indoor or covered arena may be used if the lighting is good—the better the lighting conditions, the better you will look. Make sure your helper holds the phone/video camera horizontally.
2. Prior to your opening circle, your videographer or helper must state the rider's name, the horse's name and the fence height that will be jumped. Proceed directly (no stopping and starting the video camera) to your entrance and ride the course. The sound must be turned on throughout the entire video. From the time your round begins, make sure that you and your horse are in the video frame at all times and when jumping the fence, the entire fence is in the video frame.
3. Upload your video to YouTube. Title the video upload with the rider's name and the medal section he or she wishes to be entered.

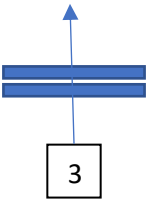
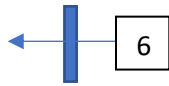
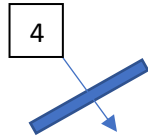
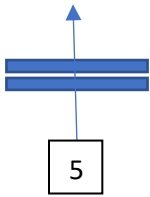
OHJA 2020 Virtual Medal Challenge

Halt at end of ring, then exit on loose rein.

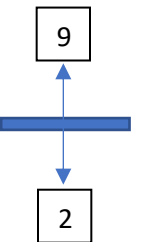
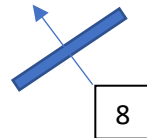
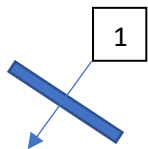
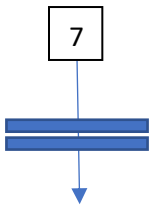


*Film round from outside of ring

Halt

By submitting my video and thereby entering this Virtual Medal Show competition (“Competition”), organized and/or managed by Oregon Hunter Jumper Association (“OHJA”), which video performance will be evaluated by an hunter/hunt seat equitation judge selected by the OHJA, and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees, and agents, I AGREE that I am subject to, and agree to be bound by, the Bylaws and Rules of the OHJA. I AGREE to release and hold harmless the OHJA and their respective officers, directors, members, representatives, employees, and agents (collectively, the “Released Parties”) for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

OHJA RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, WAIVER, AND INDEMNIFICATION: This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

As consideration for my participation in this Competition, I AGREE to the following:

- (1) the construction and application of OHJA rules are governed by the laws of the State of Oregon, and any action instituted against the OHJA must be filed in the State of Oregon;
- (2) the OHJA and Competition Management as used herein includes their respective officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, and volunteers;
- (3) I choose to participate in the Competition with the horse (“Horse”) identified on the entry blank accompanying this release as a rider, handler, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor;
- (4) I am fully aware and acknowledge that participating in horse sports, including participating in the Competition with Horse, is a dangerous activity that involves risks, including but not limited to inherent risks, that can result in an accident, loss, and serious bodily injury, including but not limited to broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, and death (collectively, “Harm”);
- (5) I AGREE to knowingly, voluntarily, and expressly assume any and all risks of Harm to me or Horse, including but not limited to Harm resulting from the negligence and excluding the gross negligence or intentional misconduct of the Released Parties;
- (6) I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Released Parties from any and all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or Horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or Horse to others. This agreement of release includes, but is not limited to, Harm that arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Released Parties, and excludes Harm that arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the gross negligence or intentional misconduct of the Released Parties;
- (7) I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Released Parties and to hold each of them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or Horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or Horse while at the premises hosting the Competition. I AGREE that this promise of indemnity includes attorneys' fees and costs incurred by the Released Parties in defending against any claims by me, or my personal representative, guardian, or heirs;
- (8) I ACKNOWLEDGE that no protective or safety equipment or device, including but not limited to riding helmets and breakaway jump cups/pins, can guard against or prevent all injuries or Harm;

(9) I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching, and abilities to safely participate in this Competition with Horse;

(10) I intend this agreement to be as broad and inclusive as permitted under Oregon law. I further intend that my submission of my Virtual Medal Show video to constitute a complete and unconditional release of all liability to the extent permitted under Oregon law;

(11) I agree that if any provision of this agreement is deemed to be unenforceable by a court of appropriate jurisdiction, then the remaining provisions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect;

(12) By submitting my video entry for the Competition, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable OHJA Rules and to the terms and conditions of this Entry Agreement; and

(13) If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation in the Competition, I AGREE to all of the above provisions, and I AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf.
